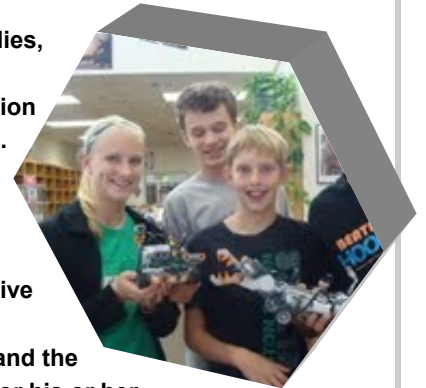
MISSION

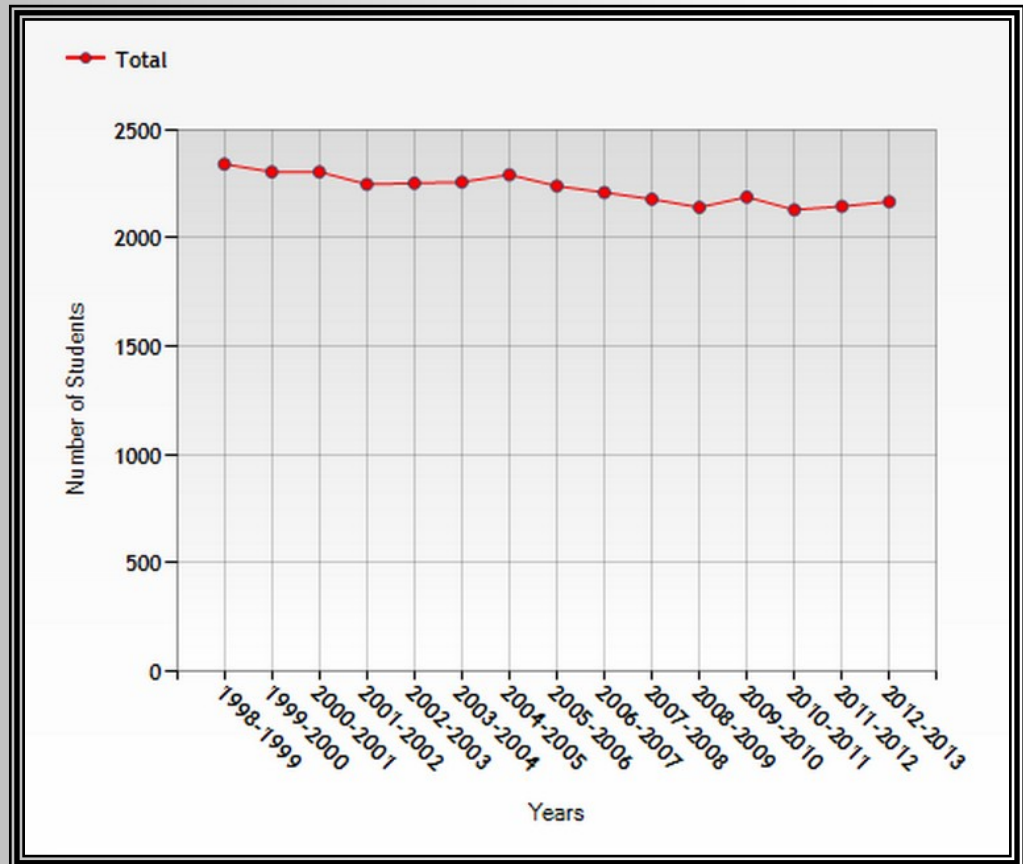

Membership Pre-Kindergarten - 12th Grade



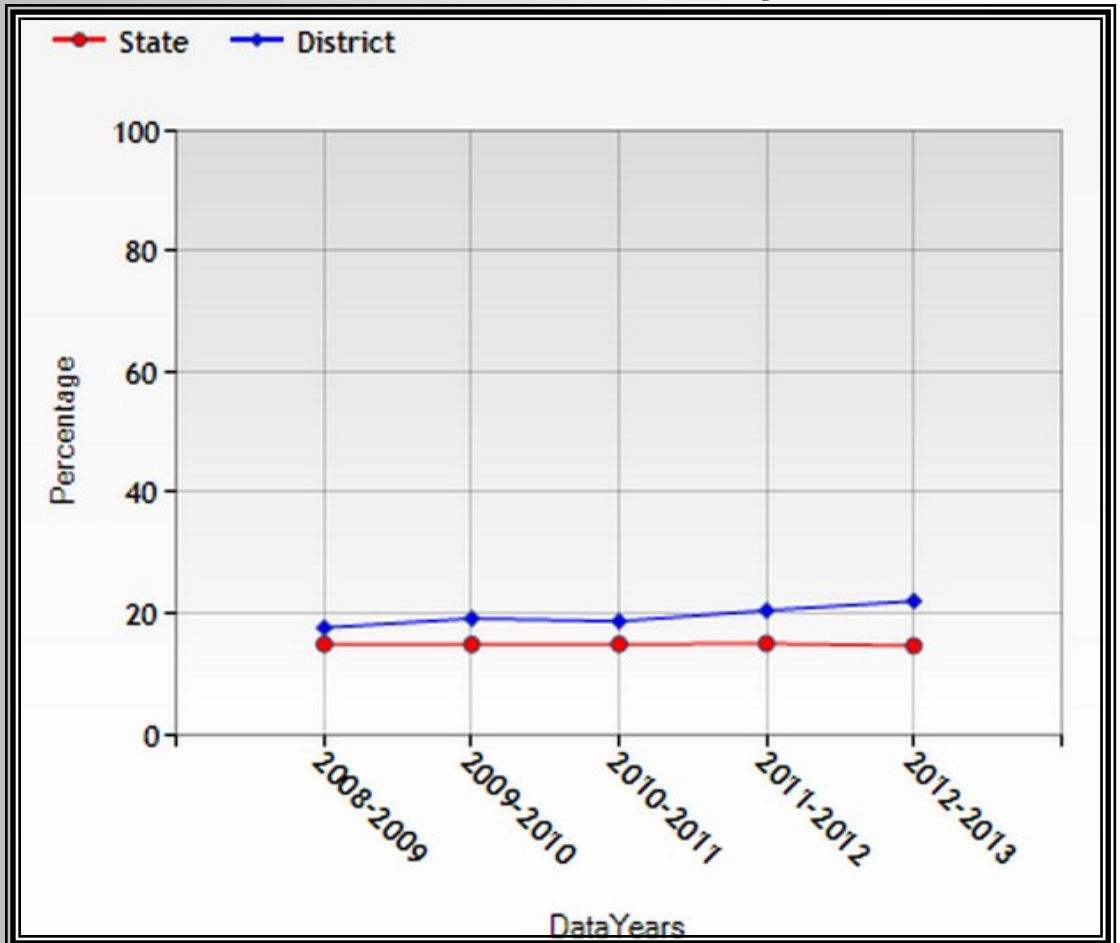

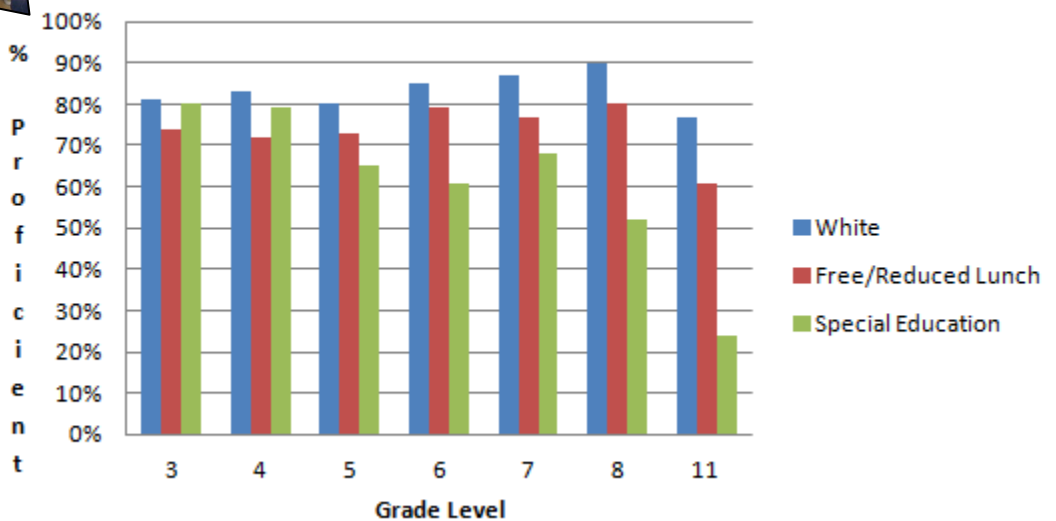


ACADEMIC SHAPE FOR 2012-2013 – READING

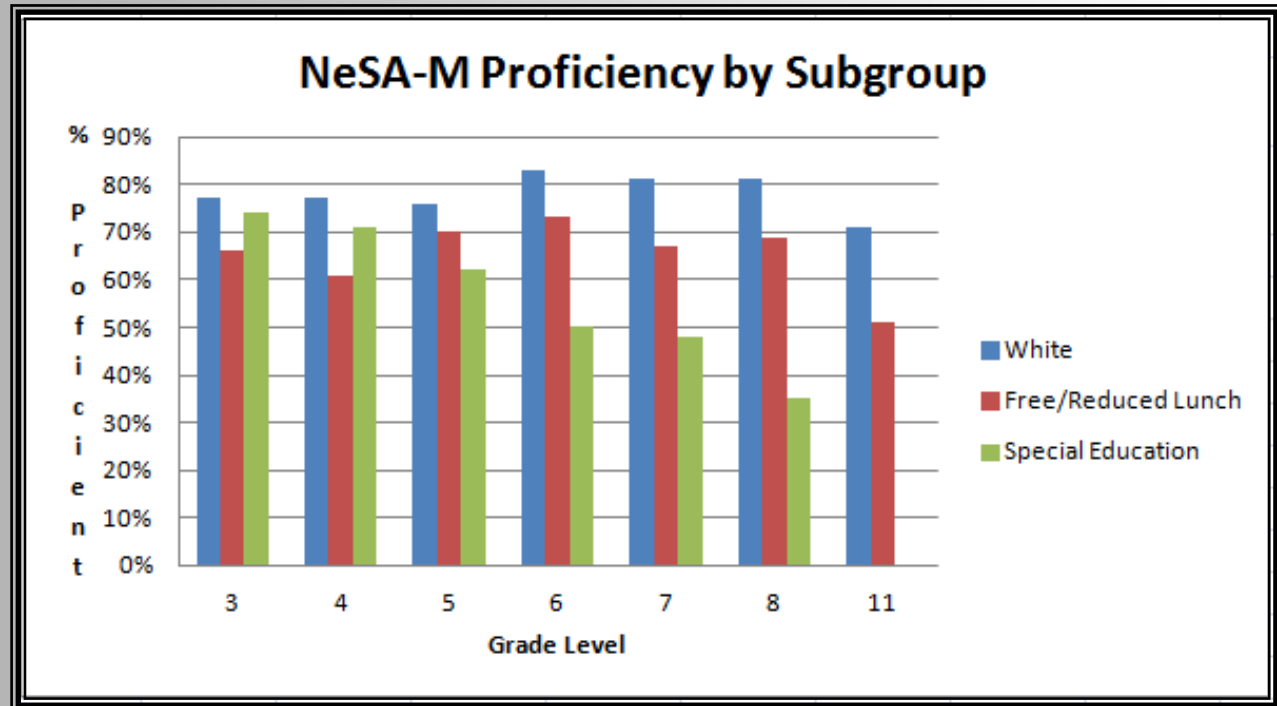
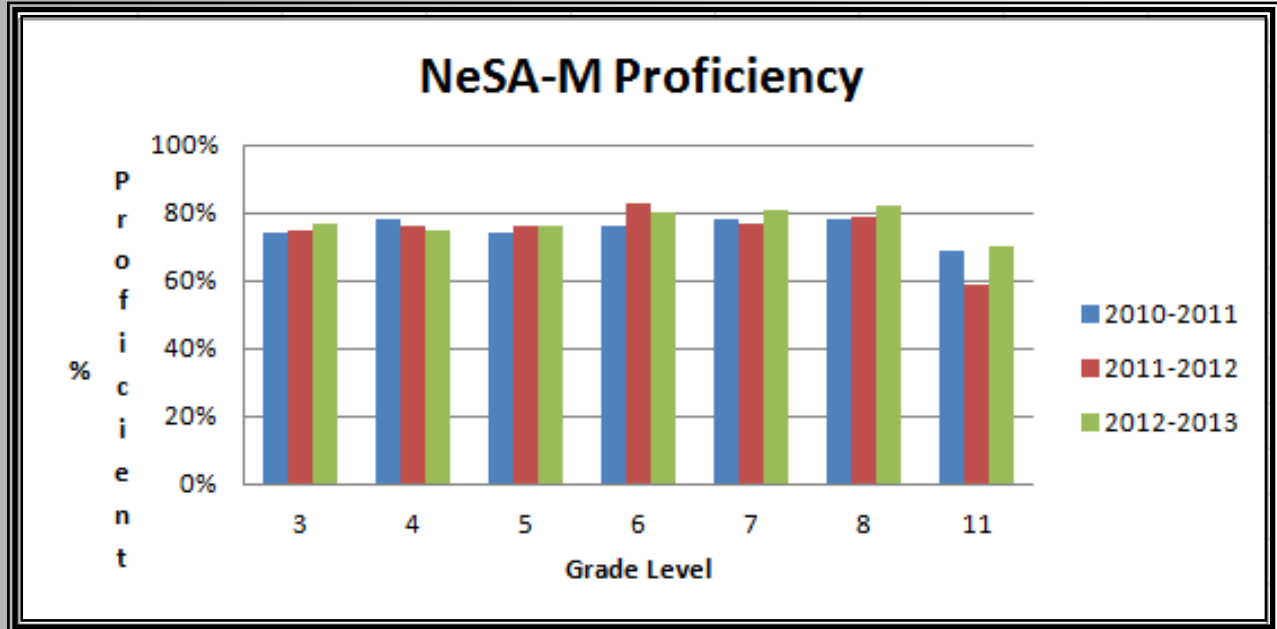
NeSA-Reading Proficiency



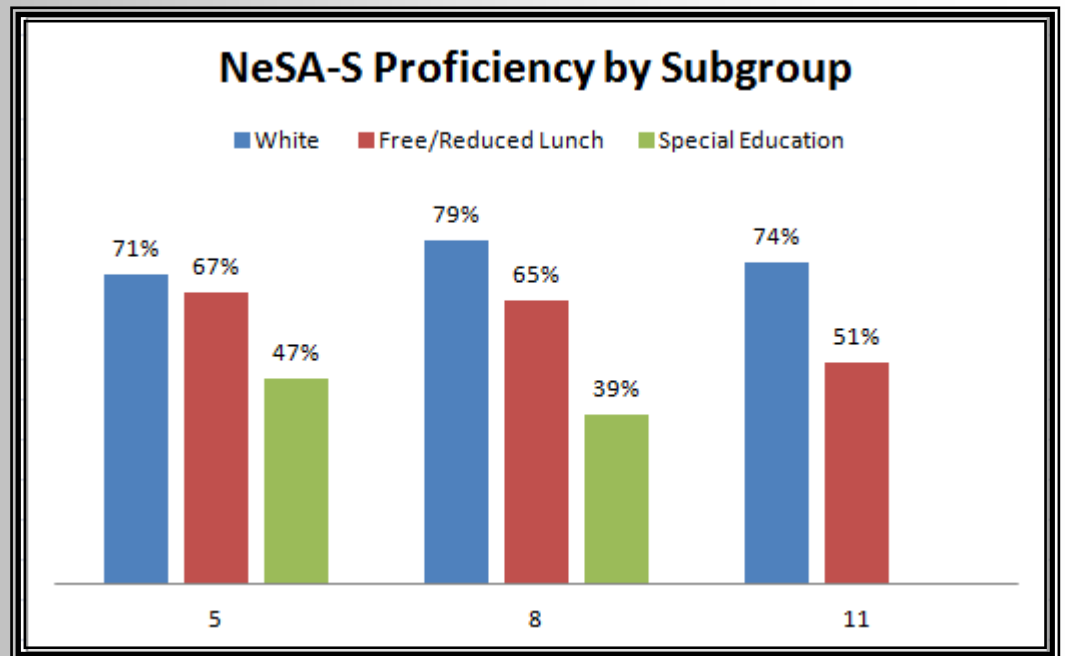
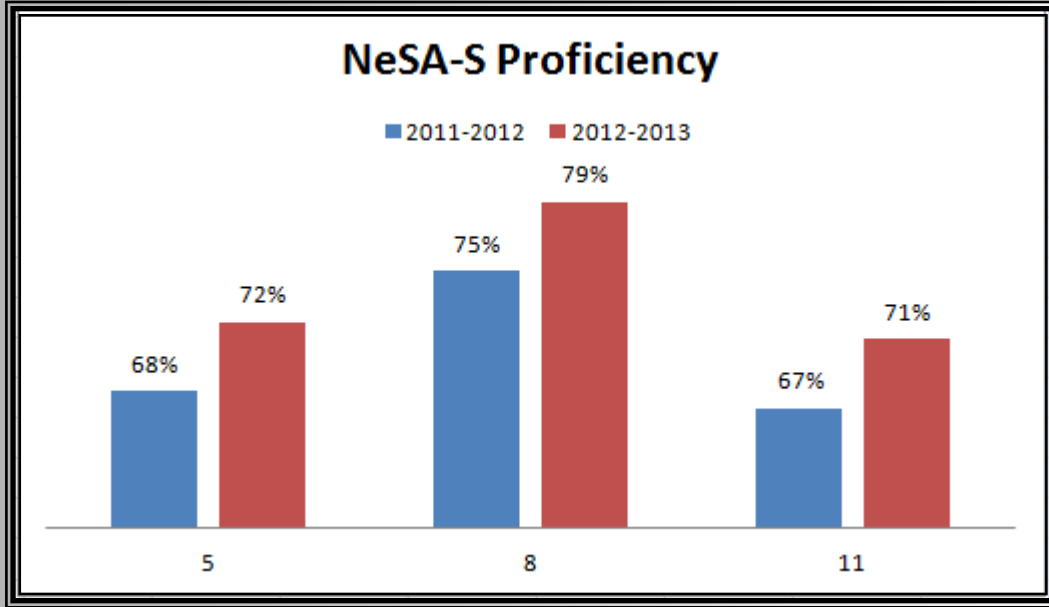
NeSA-Reading Proficiency by Subgroup



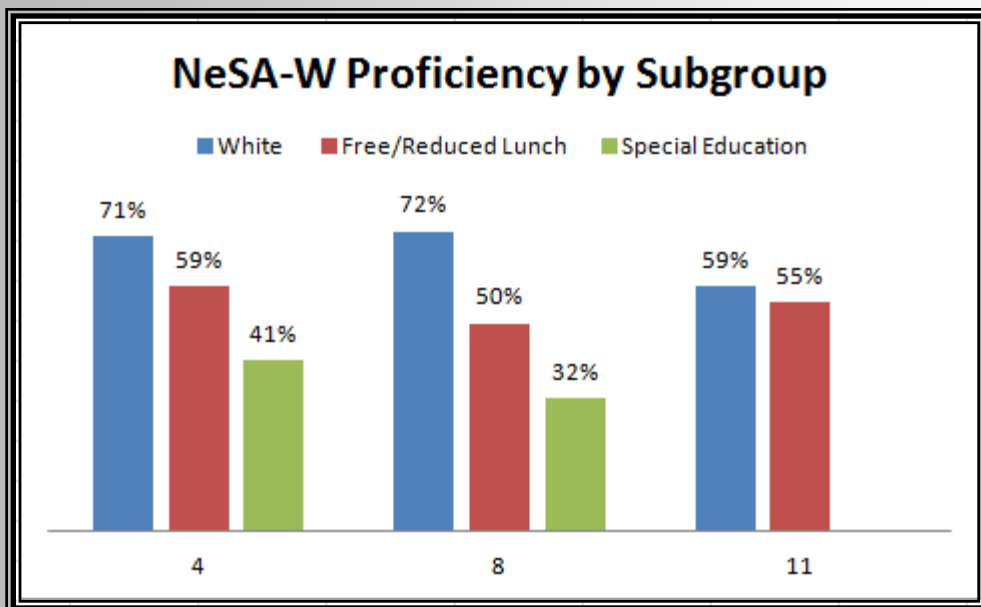
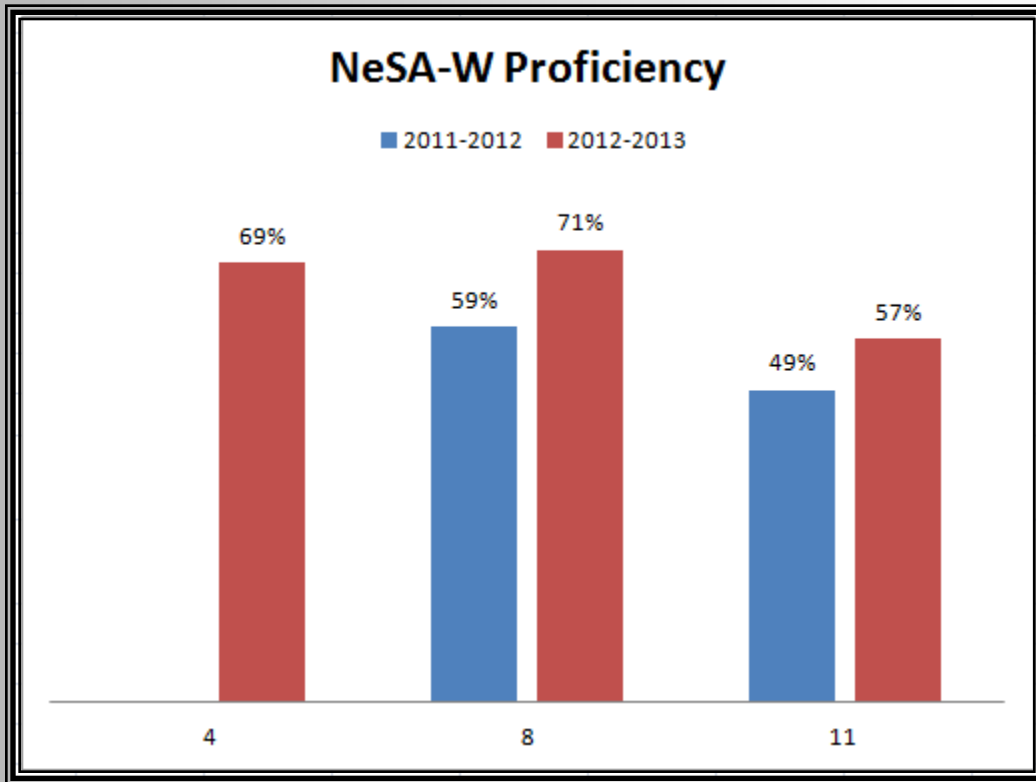
ACADEMIC SHAPE FOR 2012-2013 – MATH



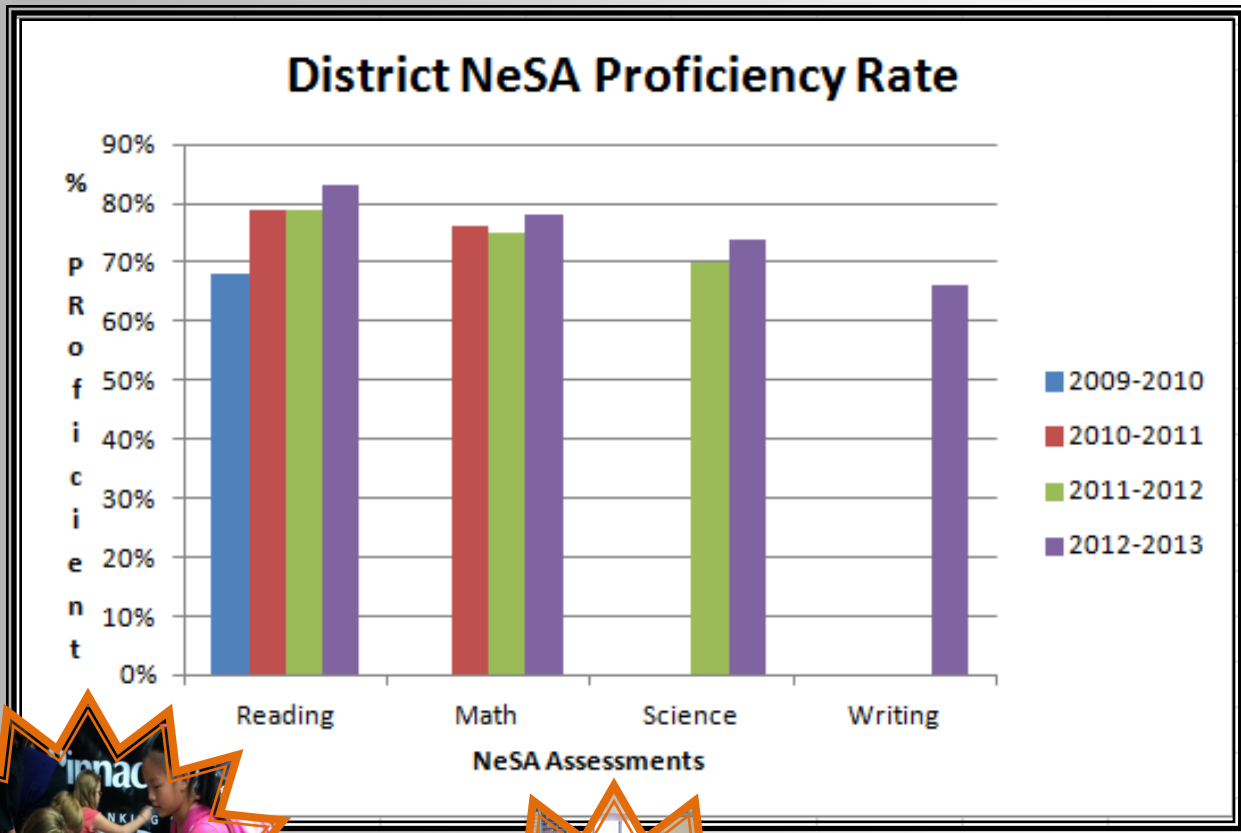
ACADEMIC SHAPE FOR 2012-2013 – SCIENCE

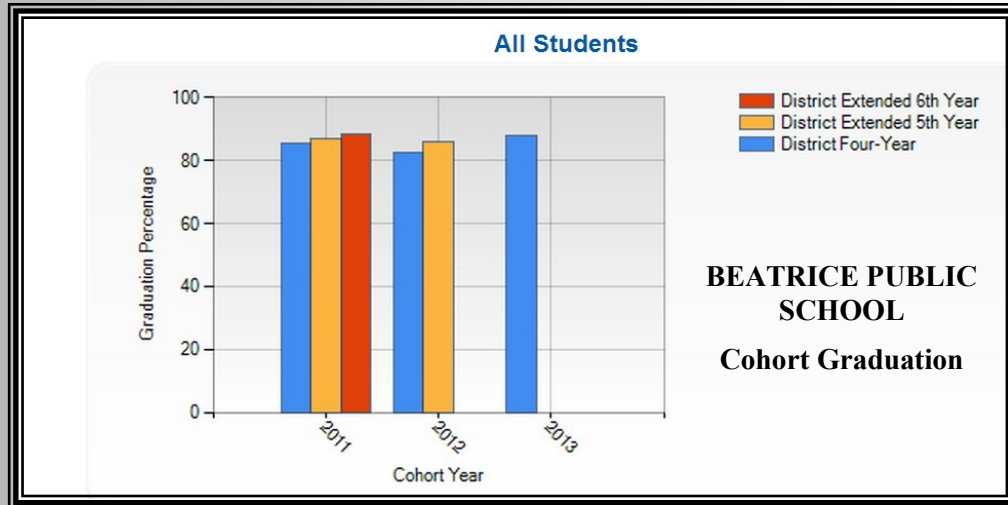
